**Administrative Report:**

  1. An update on current facilities projects and maintenance was given.
  2. The October board meeting will be held 10/14 immediately following the first meeting with the BCEA for purpose of certified contract negotiations.
  3. Negotiations will begin 10/14 with the board convening at 5:30 p.m. The board will meet with BCEA representatives at 6:00 p.m. The regular board meeting will immediately follow negotiations.
  4. A status update on the activity bus routes was given.
  5. Once daylight savings time ends 11/2, board meetings will begin at 6:30 p.m. unless otherwise advertised.

**New Business:**

- a. No patrons were present to address the board.

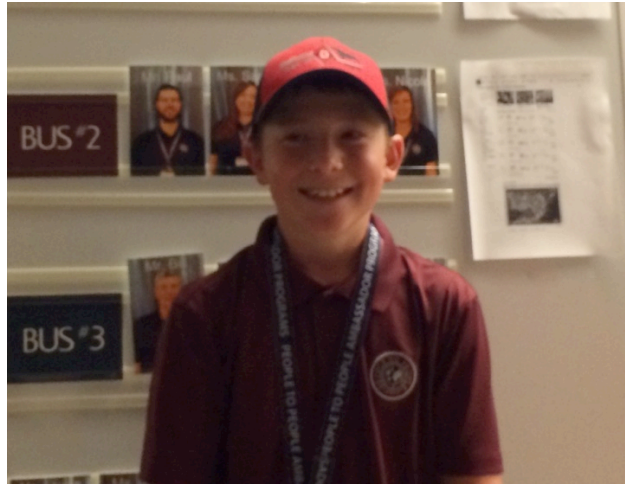

Matthew Dailey Experiences Washington D.C.

Area student Matthew Dailey, a 6th grader at Halsey Elementary, had the opportunity to travel to Washington, D.C. in June where he attended a People to People World Leadership Ambassador Program. Matthew, along with fellow delegates from around the country, participated in exploring the U.S. Capitol and learning about the branches of government and visiting the Library of Congress. The students were able to hear from diplomats at a private embassy dinner as well as hear inspiring words from Kenneth Walsh, Chief White House Correspondent. They explored the battle of Gettysburg and Eisenhower's Farm. They traveled to Arlington National Cemetery to pay tribute to the fallen soldiers, observe the eternal flame at John F. Kennedy's grave and witness the changing of the guards at the Tomb of the Unknown soldiers. Other opportunities included visiting many of the Smithsonian Museums to explore and learn about some of the country's most important treasures and visiting iconic memorials like Lincoln, Thomas Jefferson, Vietnam Veterans, World War II and Martin Luther King. Through small group leadership meetings and discussions the students learned about American History and leadership skills.

The People to People World Leadership Forum offers students a unique blend of specialized educational, leadership, and cultural exposure through a variety of programs, as well as an itinerary filled with the highlights of the hosting community. While in Washington D.C., Matthew created lifelong memories and formed lasting friendships with other Student Leaders. Participants in these programs often experience life-changing shifts in their attitudes toward individual and shared responsibilities, global leadership, and appreciation of cultural diversity, while also returning home with enhanced leadership skills and self-confidence.



On August 28, 2014 the Sandhills Elementary went to Grand Island for the Nebraska's Largest Classroom at the Nebraska State Fair. We enjoyed many great activities at the fair. We especially liked the new Nebraska building where we visited the Game and Parks, saw fish and shot air guns. We also stood on the elevation map and had a chocolate chip cookie and milk from the wheat board. They gave us a lesson on how wheat makes flour and even showed us how it is milled!

We also saw a giant robot on a big scooter. He was funny and scary! We posed for a class picture in a painting. We really enjoyed the elephant show where we met the elephants Cindy and Jenny. Cindy was very talented, she could stand on two feet! We were able to see the wolf show and met the female, Lakota who had pups that looked almost grown. We visited the largest steer, Tiny, who now weighs 3,500 lbs. Our favorite parts of the fair:

Dakota: "My favorite part of the State fair was the wolf show. I liked seeing them do tricks and the baby wolf was fun to see."

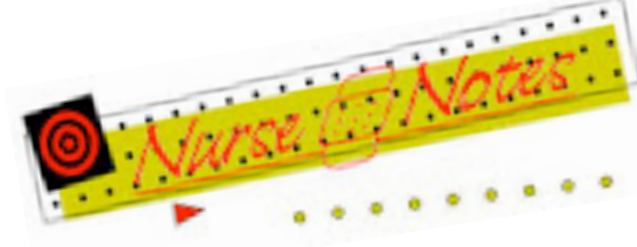
Emily: "My favorite part of the State Fair was the elephant show because of the tricks they did. I also liked the wolf show because I got to see a wolf in person."

## Nursing Notes

The Lion's Van will be at the High School October 31<sup>st</sup> starting at 8am. Students will be participating in this along with having their height & weight done. The community is invited to come in for a free vision and/or hearing screening between 8-10am.

Fall is in the air so it's time to consider getting your flu shot. The CDC recommends all ages between 6months of age and older get a flu shot.

Upper respiratory infections are common this time of year, washing your hands with soap is the number one way to prevent the spread of infections. Michigan State University just did a new study and found that after using the restroom only 5% of people washed their hands long enough to kill germs that cause infections. Yikes! Also, 33% did not use soap & 10% didn't even wash their hands! The CDC states it takes 20 seconds of hand washing to properly kill germs (sing happy birthday to yourself twice), most people only take 6 seconds to wash their hands the study found. To properly wash your hands: run water, apply soap, rub your hands together to make a lather, be sure to scrub the back of your hands, between your fingers, under your nails & around your wrists for 20 seconds, keep your hands down so suds/water don't run up your arm & avoid touching the inside of the sink, rinse well under running water and dry hands using a clean towel or air dry. If soap & water are unavailable, use an alcohol-based hand sanitizer. Times to wash your hands: before & after food preparation, before eating, before & after caring for someone who is sick, after changing a diaper or helping a child to the toilet, after blowing your nose, coughing sneezing, going to the restroom, just to name a few.

Dental hygienists will be at the grade school December 18 for free dental checks sponsored by the Loup Basin Health Dept, fluoride rinse will be optional. This a great service to take advantage of! October is National Breast Cancer Awareness Month. Breast cancer is the second most common kind of cancer in women, [healthfinder.gov](http://healthfinder.gov) is a good website for more information.

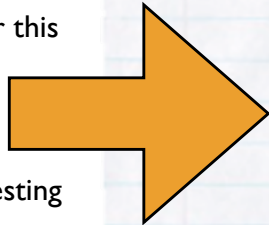
