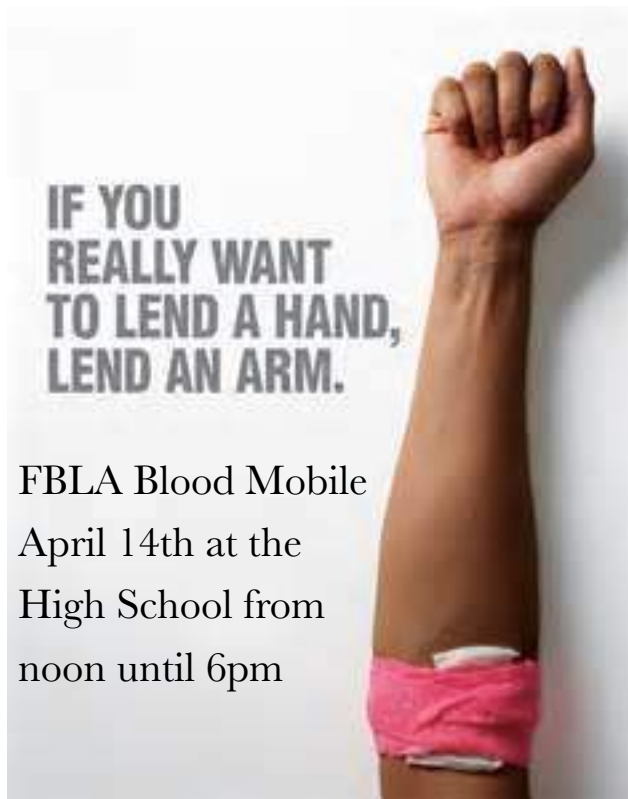

Administrative Report:

- a. Supt. Hafer discussed the following:
 1. Mrs. Ganoung was present to read her letter of resignation and thank the district. The board and administration very much appreciate her service and wish her the best in the future.
 2. Stephen Granger presented possible options to incorporate the elementary at the Dunning site. At this time, the architect discussion is for informational and exploratory purposes only. Updated information will be presented at the April board meeting.
 3. The board was updated regarding the Ag vacancy and candidate search.

Nursing Notes April 2015

Sports physicals for students 7th-12th grade for the 2015-16 school year will be Tuesday, May 12 at the High School. More information will be given to students closer to the date. Children who will be Kindergarteners this fall are required by State Law to have an eye exam, physical within 6 months of the first day of school and updated immunizations, more on this at Kindergarten Round Up. Students who will be 7th graders in the fall are required by State Law to have a Tdap (tetanus-diphtheria-pertussis) vaccine prior to the first day of school.

If you have a child that is 3 years old there is a program called “See to Learn” that your child can get a free eye exam at a participating eye doctor. There is no qualifications to take advantage of this free eye exam except that your child is 3 years old! Call your eye doctor to see if they participate in this program.

With Spring comes possible triggers for those that have asthma: pollen, cooler air & the environment. If your child carries a rescue inhaler be sure their coach or PE teacher is informed about this and talk with your child & the coach/teacher about the student having immediate access to their inhaler.

Heidi Saner Chosen to Participate in Code Crush at UNO

As part of an overall effort to close the gender gap and meet the workforce deficit in information technology, the University of Nebraska at Omaha (UNO) College of Information Technology (IS&T) hosted an information technology immersion program for 8th and 9th grade girls. Heidi Saner from Dunning, Nebraska, was chosen from over 130 applications from over 50 different communities vying for 36 spots for the 2015 class.

The program, known as “CodeCrush,” began Wednesday, March 4 and ran through Saturday, March 7. CodeCrush saw a 50 percent increase in applications from last year’s inaugural class.



For four days and three nights, participating students took part in half-day workshops in IT fields such as bioinformatics, cybersecurity, IT Innovation and making music in the computer. Morning sessions consisted of panels with current IS&T female

students, female alumni, female entrepreneurs and business leaders. Afternoon and evening sessions were filled with activities centered on information technology in Omaha, such as an IT tour of the Henry Doorly Zoo and activities with Microsoft Digigirlz. This year, the students went on a Start-Up Crawl with the Wareham Building, Flywheel and Hudl to help show them even more opportunities in technology.

A major component of CodeCrush required the students to bring a teacher-mentor to attend workshops on how to bring IT practices into their current curriculum and become IT champions in their own schools.

CodeCrush is a program lead by the University of Nebraska Foundation’s Women in IT Initiative, a community-driven task force seeking to double the number of women enrolled in UNO IS&T programs and help fill the IT workforce deficit in Omaha. Over the past two years, the Women in IT Initiative has raised over \$400,000 to fund a multitude of activities designed to introduce young women to IT as well as scholarships for women pursuing IT related degrees at IS&T.

By the year 2020, the Bureau of Labor Statistics projects there will 4.2 million jobs in computing and information technology in the United States. Despite this expected

growth, the number of available qualified IT professionals is low and women comprise just 25 percent of all computing-related occupations in the United States.

The Women in IT Initiative is funded by private donations and implemented by the NU Foundation in consultation with the Women in IT task force. The Women in IT Fund taskforce members include:
