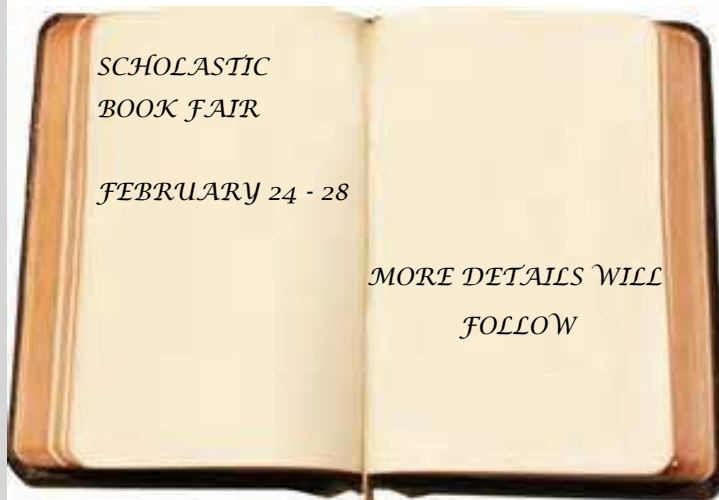

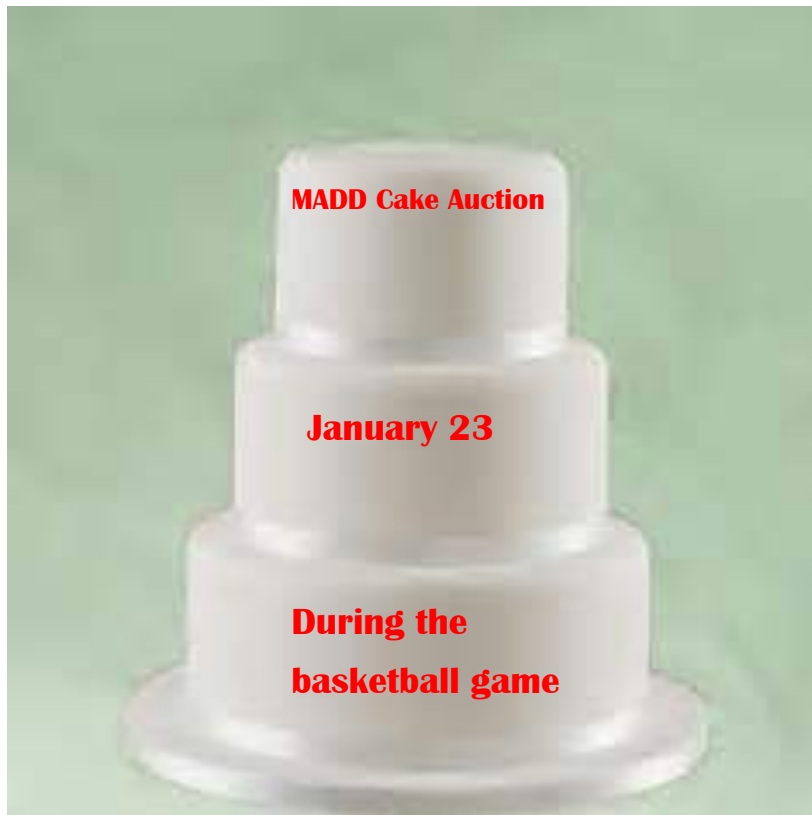

**Election of Board Officers**

**Appointment of 2015 Committees**

Motion by Teahon, second by Cox to approve 2015 committee assignments appointed. Motion passed 6-0.

**Administrative Report:**

- a. Supt. Hafer discussed the following:
  1. CG Architects presented services they could provide for possible future partial remodel, repair, or construction related to existing facilities. At this time, the board approved the firm to provide services for informational and planning purposes only.
  2. 2015 Goals retreat will be during the February 9<sup>th</sup> regular meeting.
  3. Due to the installation of the last HVAC unit at the HS, there will be no school Friday, 2/13. Mr. Hafer also reported on the door security project progress.
  4. The board authorized Supt. Hafer to purchase a used replacement car and investigate further options as needed related to the transportation fleet.
  5. No school for K-6 on 2/27 as elementary teachers will attend the state reading conference.

## Nursing Notes

February is American Heart Month, National Children's Dental Health Month, National Grapefruit Month and of course we celebrate Valentine's Day. For some healthy choices for that Valentine's Day party here are some ideas: Heart Melon Treats: using a small heart shaped cookie cutter carefully cut out hearts from watermelon, pineapple, honeydew, cantaloupe or kiwi, add a popsicle stick to the fruit. How about Angel Food Cake & Fruit Kabobs: cut store bought angel food cake into chunks, add to wooden skewer alternating with a strawberry that has been cut in half the long way (to represent a heart) and blackberries—yum! Valentine Fruit Cups: use mini valentine cupcake wrappers & add pieces of fruit, or cut out mini heart shapes from cheese slices & whole wheat pita or flat bread for a mini heart shaped sandwich! 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## It's FAFSA Time!

If you're a college-bound senior, you must complete the [FAFSA](#) (Free Application for Federal Student Aid) to apply for state, federal and college-based financial aid. Submit the form before your college's FAFSA priority date (typically between March 1 and April 1) as some financial aid is awarded first-come, first-served. Check with your college to learn their specific date.

## Follow these steps to complete the FAFSA:

**Complete your taxes early** as the FAFSA requires current tax information. Within three weeks after you and your parents file your tax forms, your IRS data should be available to retrieve and transfer into your FAFSA through the [IRS Data Retrieval](#) process.

## Gather these [student and parent items](#):

- 2014 federal income tax forms and, if applicable, Schedule K-1 (Form 1065)
- 2014 W-2 forms
- Student's driver's license number
- Social Security numbers
- Birth dates
- Date parents were married, separated, divorced or widowed
- Current cash, savings and checking account balances
- Current investment values (stocks, bonds, mutual funds, CDs, etc.) excluding your home and retirement accounts
- Value of business (if more than 100 employees)
- Value of investment farm (Do not include the value of a family farm that you or your parents live on and operate.)
- 2014 child support (paid and/or received)
- 2014 Workers' Compensation
- Other untaxed income in 2014 such as housing/food/ living allowances for military and clergy
- Alien Registration Number for eligible non-citizens

## Be prepared to answer the following FAFSA question:

Did you or anyone in your household receive any of the following federal benefits?

- Supplemental Security Income
- SNAP (Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program)
- TANF ((Temporary Assistance for Needy Families)
- Free or Reduced Price Lunch
- WIC (Special Supplemental Nutrition Program for Women, Infants and Children)

**Complete and file the FAFSA** at [FAFSA.gov](#). The colleges you list on the application will receive the results.

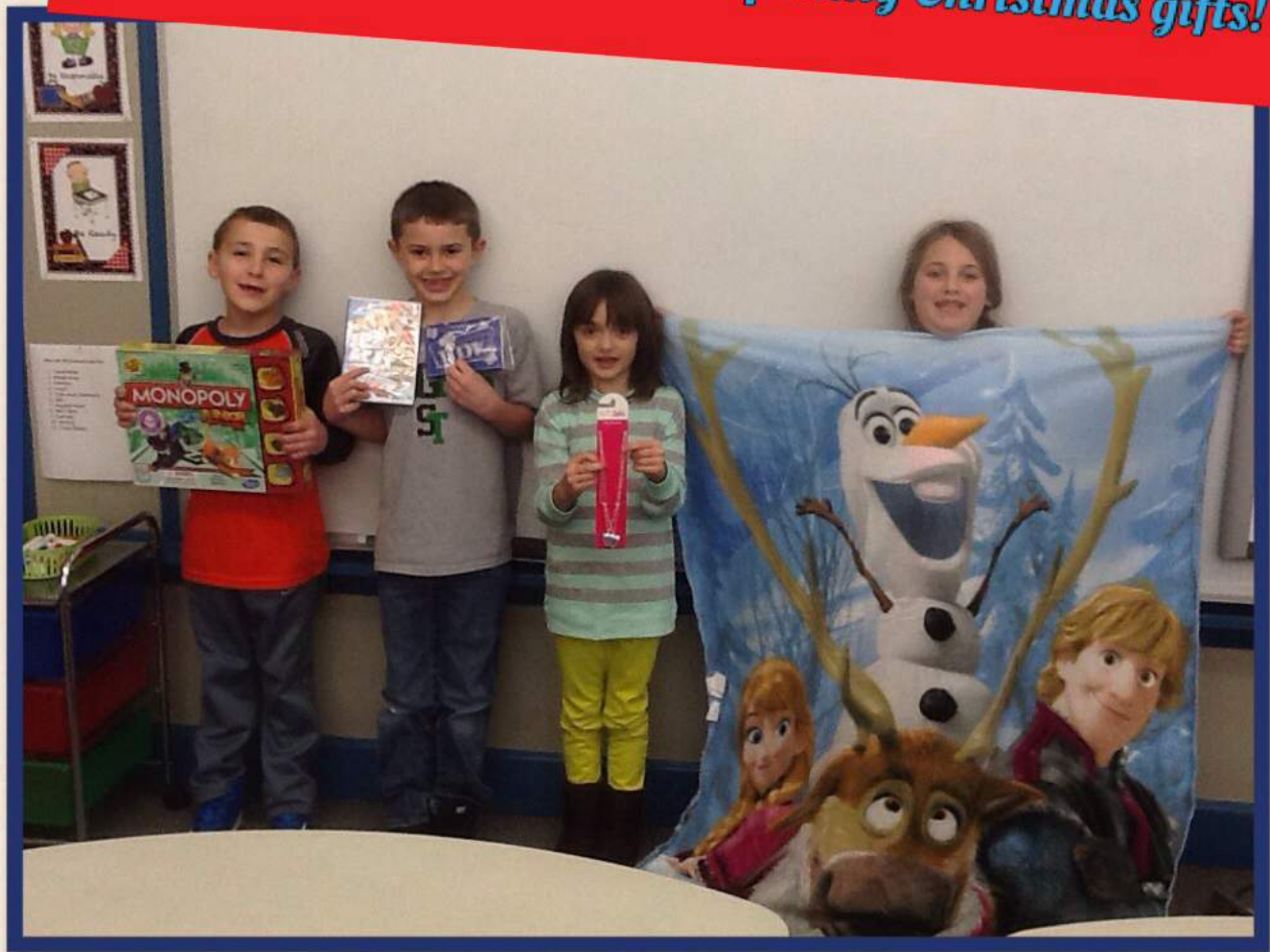


